<u>Municipal Manager's Report to Council on the Deviation from and ratification of minor breaches from the Procurement processes for November 2015.</u>

PURPOSE

To submit a report to Council on the deviation from procurement processes and ratification of minor breaches from the procurement process for November 2015.

BACKGROUND

In terms of Section 36 of the Supply Chain Management Policy: Deviation from, and ratification of minor breaches of procurement processes:

- (1) "The accounting officer may –
- (a) dispense with the official procurement processes established by this Policy and to procure any required goods or services through any convenient process, which may include direct negotiations, but only
 - (i) in an emergency;
 - (ii) if such goods or services are produced or available from a single provider only;
 - (iii) for the acquisition of special works of art or historical objects where specifications are difficult to compile;
 - (iv) acquisition of animals for zoos and/or nature and game reserves;
 - (v) in any other exceptional case where it is impractical or impossible to follow the official procurement processes; and
- (b) ratify any minor breaches of the procurement processes by an official or committee acting in terms of delegated powers or duties which are purely of a technical nature.
- (2) The accounting officer must record the reasons for any deviations in terms of subparagraphs (1) (a) and (b) of this policy and report them to the next meeting of the council and include as a note to the annual financial statements."

Attached as Annexure A (pp 1-3) please find the instances in November 2015 where the prescribed procurement processes were not followed and the deviations were approved in terms of the Municipal Manager's delegated powers.

In terms of Section 36 (1)(b) of the SCM Policy the Municipal Manager is also allowed to ratify any minor breach of the procurement processes made by a committee acting in terms of delegated powers which are purely of a technical nature. The following minor breach, as reported to the bid committees, was ratified:

 I (WW) 12/2015: Appointment of a service provider for the rental of Chlorine gas cylinders at Percy Stewart, Magaliesburg and Flip Human waste water treatment works on an as and when required basis for the period of three (3) years.

In this instance the above mentioned tender was awarded to Metsi Chem on 19 May 2015 and the clause for transportation was omitted from the recommendations. It is requested that it be included as was included in the original tender submission. It was stated that transport rates will be adjusted in accordance with the published Diesel and Fuel adjustment (statutory and non-statutory) as received from contracted haulers and verified by the SEIFAS Tables L1 and L2 basis to be used is the

published index in February 09 tables page 12. Furthermore that there would be an annual transport rate adjustment and a quarterly adjustment on the fuel price fluctuations. Attached as Annexure B.

RECOMMENDED TO MUNICIPAL COUNCIL:

- 1. that Council takes note of the item as per Annexure A (pp 1-3) where the official procurement process was dispensed with, for reasons as mentioned in the report, with the approval of the Municipal Manager, for November 2015.
- 2. that Council takes note of the ratification of the minor breaches as per Annexure B (pp 4) of the procurement processes by an official or committee acting in terms of delegated powers which are purely of a technical nature for the following tender:
 - I (WW) 12/2015: Appointment of a service provider for the rental of Chlorine gas cylinders at Percy Stewart, Magaliesburg and Flip Human waste water treatment works.
- 3. that above be included by the Chief Financial Officer as a note to the 2015/2016 annual financial statements.

Once these confirmation letters have been received from the service providers the applicable rates will be implemented as from the 1 July 2015 on a month to month basis until such time when the new vehicles are delivered. There are new and existing service providers which will be affected regarding this arrangement, namely Fleet Africa (Pty) Ltd, Fleetmatics (Pty) Ltd and Aqua Plant Hire (Pty) Ltd rendering the services for sedans, LDV's and specialized vehicles.
